Exceeding – Embedded Practice

Educators' contributions to maintenance:

Educators ensure indoor and outdoor spaces remain safe, clean, and well-maintained through daily checks and active reporting of any hazards. They monitor and address risks, such as broken furniture or contaminated sandpits, and follow cleaning schedules, contributing to ongoing upkeep. Educators also model safety, guiding children in safe play practices, and stay updated with Kidsafe and ACCC guidelines, thus fostering a secure environment.

Daily Visual Checks Educators conduct a daily scan of all areas before

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children arrive, checking for potential hazards like broken toys, sharp edges, or damaged outdoor equipment. This proactive approach allows educators to address issues before children interact with these spaces.

Routine Cleaning Schedules

Educators follow a structured cleaning routine, sanitising high-touch surfaces, toys, and equipment regularly. For example, tables are wiped down after each use, and toys are disinfected weekly to minimise the spread of germs.

Involving Children in Basic Tidying

Educators encourage children to participate in simple tidying tasks, like putting away toys or wiping down their eating area. This practice teaches children respect for their environment while ensuring that items are safely stored and clean.

Clear Communication on Maintenance Needs

Educators are trained to report any issues they observe, such as a loose fence or broken play equipment, immediately. They document these observations and follow up with maintenance staff to ensure repairs are completed promptly.

Regular Deep Clean Sessions

In addition to daily routines, educators coordinate monthly deep-cleaning sessions, involving tasks like carpet steaming and washing soft furnishings. This deep cleaning helps maintain hygiene levels and reduces allergens, creating a healthier space for children and staff.

Following Safety Standards for Equipment Use

Educators ensure that all equipment, such as cots and high chairs, meet Australian safety standards and are in good condition. They routinely check that folding mechanisms and locks function properly, preventing potential accidents.

Pest Management and Environmental Safety

Educators monitor for signs of pests, ensuring food is stored securely and waste is managed effectively. This vigilance reduces the risk of contamination and keeps both indoor and outdoor spaces sanitary.

Modelling and Reinforcing Safe Practices

Educators model safe practices, such as wiping spills immediately or ensuring children use equipment correctly. By demonstrating these habits, they create a culture of safety and cleanliness that children begin to adopt as part of their daily routine.
